Principal's Corner

At Trinity, we use Love and Logic as a method of managing our students. This is a way to empower students to make decisions and choices. For some students, they don't want to be told what to do and it can create conflict.

We try our best to match the consequence to the action and hold the student accountable for making their wrongs right. As parents, you can use some Love and Logic techniques as well.

- 1. Give your children small choices that you are ok with. a) bedtime story, b) spot at the table or seat in the car, c) do homework now or in 10 minutes.
- 2. Say "yes" often to little things so that when you have to say "no," it is accepted.
- 3. Allow children to make mistakes and to fail. It is from our failure that we learn.
- 4. Guide children to solve their own problems.
 - a) Provide a sincere dose of empathy.
 Empathy opens the heart and the mind to learning.
 - b) Ask, "What do you think you are going to do?" Asking this question gently, yet firmly, places the problem in their hands. It also sends a powerful message of confidence. "I believe in you."
 - c) Ask, "Would you like to hear how some people might solve this?" If your child says, "no", then be respectful of their answer.
 - d) Provide 2 or 3 solutions to the problem. After each suggestion ask, "how do you think this would work for you?"
 - e) End with, "I'm excited to see how you work this out, let me know how things turn out."

Our goal is to raise independent children who are able to make good decisions. So, we have to teach them how to problem solve and make decisions from a young age.
