#### Principal's Corner

You may have heard the teachers or me talk about Love and Logic. This is the behavior management system we use here at Trinity to help our students manage their own behavior and choices. Some management systems work from a series of consequences that can be a loss of privilege or time away from the group. These steps are exactly the same for everyone and for every situation.

With Love and Logic, we give logical consequences that fit the situation and the student. This allows us to know each child and the situation behind the behavior. A natural consequence is a little different from a logical consequence. The student who is cold at recess, because they don't have a jacket, has a natural consequence. Having a messy locker or bedroom and as a result has lost their homework, now has a natural consequence. Turning in a paper that was due on Monday and turning it in late on Tuesday to receive a deduction in the grade; this is a natural consequence.

It is important for parents and teachers to not rescue children from these natural consequences. Having natural consequences is what makes your children stronger and gives them grit. Guaranteed, they will learn from a natural consequence if you do not intervene.

It's much better to have students learn these small lessons in a safe place when the stakes are small. Lead with empathy when your child experiences a natural consequence. "I'm sorry you were cold during recess, what could you do next time to make sure you are warm enough during recess?" "That must feel disappointing or upsetting when you get a late grade."

Because we love our children, our first instinct is to help the child solve the problem or even solve it for them. It's important for parents to not solve these small troubles for the child. These are significant steps to raising independent children who make age appropriate decisions on their own.
