# Principal's Corner

When you reflect on your childhood, you probably recognize that times have changed. You may have had more freedom because your parents weren't worried about safety. You could play outside unsupervised, all throughout the neighborhood. Maybe you were less into technology, screens and phones than kids are today. We didn't have cell phones to look up virtually everything and you were charged by the minute for long distance calls. Sometimes change is good, and other times we long for the days of the past.

Many of our students have only used a cell phone and never a landline phone. Phone skills for our young students seem to be a skill students are lacking. As parents, you can help your child by teaching them conversational skills over the phone. "Hello mom, this is Suzy. Could you please bring me my band instrument that I forgot?" You would be surprised at how many students don't have basic phone etiquette.

For students of today, map skills means putting an address into Google maps or the GPS car system and it tells you where to go. As a family, do you pull out the road atlas and study the trip you are about to take? Do you map out the route with stops along the way or do you rely on AI to do it for you? I would encourage you to study the atlas with your children. Find interesting stops along the way, map distance and time between the stops. There are so many lessons that can happen along the way. Don't just rely on Siri to tell you where to go (it may not get it right).

Map skills and phone etiquette; let's bring the old ways back!
