# Principal's Corner

The changing of the seasons from summer to fall is becoming more evident every day. The temperatures are cool in the morning with bright sunshine by afternoon. The leaves are turning beautiful reds, yellows and oranges and I am more aware of the darkness that is settling in the evenings and it's still dark when I get to school

Changes...we know it's going to happen, we expect it, and yet sometimes it can be hard.

Change can be hard for children too and I'm not just talking about the seasons. It can be hard to change schools, move up a grade, get a new teacher, learn new expectations from the teacher, learn a new schedule, move from elementary to middle school. Sometimes changes can be hard for students and other times the students are ready and excited for the changes.

Change isn't always the big things, it can also be small things that can throw your child for a loop. A different person picking up or dropping off, a sub in the classroom, a change in your nightly routine or schedule. These little changes can also be hard on a child.

The only thing that is constant is change, so how do you prepare your child? As much as possible, prepare your child in advance for the changes that will occur. Talk about the change leading up to it 2-3 days in advance. Present the change in a positive light. Tell your child specifically the behavior you expect during the transition. Repeat this each time you talk about it.

I see some of these same things happening in the classroom. When the routines or schedules change, the teachers tell the students in advance and what can be expected of them.

Many things change: seasons, schedules, the time, deadlines, jobs etc. But Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever. Hebrews 13:8.
